# Research and Development

The outcome of PITAHC's Research and Development activities is a robust body of knowledge in aid of policy, programs development, and products development for the promotion of quality, safe, effective/beneficial, accessible, and acceptable traditional and complementary medicine (T&CM) products and services, and for the conservation of our cultural heritage on Philippine traditional medicine.

### RESEARCHES ADOPTED BY THE INDUSTRY





PITAHC, in partnership with the Ateneo de Manila University, introduced the book "Encyclopedia of Medicinal Plants, Volume 3" during the Research Dissemination Forum on October 14, 2021. The book contains the thirty (30) common medicinal plants of the Philippines. It provides updated fundamental scientific information on the Philippine medicinal plants using peer-reviewed research journal sources and reliable primary sources. The encyclopedia was officially launched in the Traditional and Alternative Health Care (TAHC) Congress last November 29-30, 2021 in La Bella, Tagaytay City.



Last October 14-15, 2021, the Institute conducted an online Research Dissemination Forum wherein seven (7) PITAHC-funded projects were presented. 

# 2. DOH CHD R4b (MIMAROPA) - Role of Herbal Medicines in the Fight Against COVID-19

November is designated as the TAHC Month per Presidential Proclamation 698 s 2004. As part of the celebration, Dr. Angelo Ong gave a lecture to the DOH CHD R4b (MIMAROPA) on the role of herbal medicines in the fight against COVID-19 and featured current researches on some mechanisms of action and bioactive compounds. The country has a very rich herbal medicine tradition and in order for it to be integrated into the mainstream healthcare system, its use must be supported by evidence and clinical trial research. Some herbs have already been identified as useful in the control of symptoms in COVID19 and yet we still need to do more research work to benefit every Filipino.

3. LTFRB NCR on the topic of mental health during COVID-19, November 20, 2021





Dr. Angelo Ong was invited to speak for the stakeholders of the LTFRB NCR on the topic of mental health during COVID-19. As part of the TAHC Month, he shared some non-pharmacologic interventions in handling mental stresses, anxiety and depression. He shared ways to identify anxiety through a simple 10 point test and give them tips on how to handle and avert it. There are also herbs that he mentioned which can help with insomnia and promote a sense of calm during these troubling times. With all what is going on with COVID-19, herbs can help even with mental health.

Talking and engaging with students is always exciting for him because they are the future of the country. Herbal medicine has been given a boost in the fight against the pandemic with many researchers taking up the challenge of finding possible medicines to alleviate the suffering of our countrymen who were hit by the disease. He applauded all the researchers and shared his hope that the future pharmacists of CEU follow in our footsteps to discover, develop, promote and advocate the safe and effective use of herbal medicines.

# 4. CEU- College of Pharmacy - Use of Herbal Medicines as Adjunct Therapy in COVID-19

As part of the TAHC Month, Dr. Angelo Ong gave a very engaging talk about the use of herbal medicines as adjunct therapy in COVID-19 to the CEU College of Pharmacy, Centro Escolar University Makati. In the webinar he discussed the possible mechanisms of action of Tawa-tawa, VCO and Lagundi herbs in the treatment of the symptoms of the disease. He mentioned some of the researchers carrying on doing their hardest work despite the limitations of the pandemic.



### 3. LTFRB NCR on the topic of mental health during COVID-19 November 20, 2021



The DOH CHD R4A R&D Unit CALABARZON recently conducted its 4th Health Research Forum. Dr. Angelo Ong served as a reactor in the presentation "Improved Regulation for Herbal Medicines using Weak Affinity Chromatography (WAC)". WAC is used to validate and evaluate herbal medicines for various indications for their safety and efficacy. There is a need to do researches on laboratory techniques which produce cost effective yet reliable and reproducible results. An example of such is the affinity of herbal fractions to albumin. Because drug molecules bind with albumin, it affects clearance rates and effective dosages in its final drug form. Since albumin can be used in the WAC column, it can evaluate the pharmacokinetics of the herb fractions as in the blood stream.

# Continuing Education Program Guidelines



Continuing education is important to the practitioners for them to be abreast on the current development and expand their knowledge and skills in the practice of T&CM. The different members of the National Certification Committees of eight (8) modalities formulated the Guidelines on the Accreditation of the Continuing Education Program for T & CM.

# Anthroposophic Medicine Guidelines



The "Guidelines on the National Certification of Anthroposophic Medical Practitioners and Accreditation of Anthroposophic Medicine Training Program, Centers and Clinics" was approved by the Board of Trustees (BOT) and was published in the Official Gazette of the University of the Philippines.

# **Ayurveda Guidelines**



Two public consultations were conducted on the formulation of "Guidelines on the National Certification of Ayurveda Practitioners, and Accreditation of Ayurveda Lifestyle Education and Training Programs, Ayurveda Lifestyle Training Institutes/Ayurveda Schools and Ayurveda Centers and Ayurveda Clinics" and was submitted to the Office of the Government Corporate Counsel for legal opinion.

### **Osteopathy Guidelines**



The "Guidelines on the National Certification of Osteopaths and Accreditation of Osteopathy Training Programs, Centers, and Clinics" was published in the Official Gazette in January 2021.

# Certification and Accreditation of T&CM Practitioners, Clinics, Training Centers and TAHC Organizations

For CY 2021, a total of eighty (80) applications for certification of practitioners and accreditation of clinics, training program, training centers and TAHC organizations for Acupuncture, Chiropractic and Naturopathy were approved with issuance of their corresponding IDs and certificates.

Monitoring is done to ensure that the certified practitioners and accredited clinics and facilities have continuously complied with the set of requirements to capably provide services to their clients and customers. These requirements include available certificate of registrations and business permits, clean and complete facilities and equipment, adequate and competent personnel, and existing policies in order to ensure that quality, reliable and safe services are provided to the public.


### **LGU Orientation on Certification and Accreditation**



PITAHC works in coordination with the Local Government Units (LGUs) for the promotion of the different modalities and to ensure that the practitioners comply with the requirements before they can practice or establish TAHC facilities at the local levels. This is also a way of safeguarding the consumers from patronizing services from unregistered or uncertified practitioners.

For this year, five (5) LGU orientations were conducted on the certification and accreditation process. This was done in coordination with the HPPs and TAHC Coordinators in different regions such as Region III (Zambales), Region VII (Cebu), CARAGA, Region IV-B (MIMAROPA), and the National Capital Region (NCR) employing onsite or offsite methods via Zoom platform. The orientations were participated in by the various City Health Officers (CHOs), Business Permits and Licensing Officers (BPLOs), and other LGU employees.

The Division also participated in the various Stakeholders' meetings and coordinated with other modalities such as Homeopathy, Naturopathy, Chiropractic, and Hilot

# **Traditional and Alternative Health Care Congress**



In line with the TAHC month celebration every November, PITAHC conducted the webinar version of "13th TAHC Congress" which was held last November 29-30, 2021 in La Bella, Tagaytay City with the theme "Traditional and Complementary Medicine: Promoting holistic health and wellness". The "13th TAHC Congress" webinar is hosted with the aim to bring together academicians, practitioners, researchers and the general public through the topics on traditional and alternative health care. Likewise, this event engage the participants in discussion, and facilitate mutual understanding on the significance of Traditional and Complementary Medicine in ensuring healthy lives and promoting wellbeing. Likewise of Seal of Excellence Award was launched during the said event.





The said event also serve as a venue for discussion and review of the strategic health policies and operational issues concerning appropriate integration of Traditional and Complementary Medicine into the Universal Health Care.





A total of two hundred fifty eight (258) participants including the speakers, practitioners and members of the National Certification Committee of the different TAHC modalities attended the event.

# Establishment of TAHC Centers in DOH-Retained Hospitals

PITAHC in partnership with the DOH-retained hospitals established TAHC centers in their respective hospitals. The aim of the program is to support hospitals in providing safe, quality and effective T&CM services and their appropriate integration into health systems for the management of common health conditions and for achieving universal health coverage. These TAHC Centers offer Acupuncture as one of their services being offer offered to the general public.

The following are the DOH-retained hospitals that have established TAHC Center/Clinic in their hospitals:

- 2. San Fernando La Union Treatment and Rehabilitation Center
- 3. Region 2 Trauma and Medical Center
- 4.Lt. Tidang Memorial Hospital Wellness Center

### 1st Regional Hilot Congress



The 1st Regional PITAHC Hilot Congress was conducted via Zoom and Facebook live streaming simultaneously in Malay Aklan on October 27-30, 2021 with the theme: "Hilot: Pangangalaga sa Kalusugan ngayong Pandemya".







The main objective of the 1st Regional HILOT Congress is to discuss and review strategic health policies and operational issues concerning the appropriate integration of Hilot practice into the National Health Care delivery system and eventually in the Universal Health Care (UHC). PITAHC had invited 10 traditional healers (hilot/manghihilot) from each region and shared their best practices. The event highlighted the rich traditions of different Hilot practitioners from Western Visayas with their potential contribution to our Philippine Traditional Medicine (Hilot) in the attainment of UHC.

# **Hospital Congress**

The 3<sup>rd</sup> Hospital Congress on Traditional and Complementary Medicine with the theme "Health Beyond Pandemic: Traditional and complementary Medicine in Improving the Health and Wellbeing of Patient and Population." was held on August 26 and 27, 2021 through online platform via Zoom. The 2-day hospital congress aims to provide a venue for discussion and review of strategic health policies and operational issues on the establishment of TAHC centers in DOH-retained and private hospitals for the management of common health conditions and development of models of best health care delivery on T&CM.







The event was participated by Medical Center Chiefs of the different hospitals, and a total number of participants including speakers, practitioners, and members of the NCC for the Hospital Congress were 328 during the first day and 392 during the second day.

### T & CM Advocacies



Throughout the year, advocacy activities were undertaken specifically community orientation using the book Patnubay sa Paggamit ng Halamang Gamot on the preparation and use of herbal medicines to treat common ailments at the primary health care level. Acupressure and ear acupuncture for pain management were also carried out in the different communities nationwide. Radio guesting and personal appearances were likewise done in Metro Manila and disseminated information on the use of herbal medicines for the treatment of COVID-19 symptoms.









# Herbal Processing Plants

The three (3) Herbal Processing Plants (HPPs) located in Tuguegarao, Tacloban and Davao Cities are PITAHC's production and research facilities. They also assist in implementing the Institute's three (3) Major Final Outputs such as Research and Development Services, Technical Advisory and Advocacy Services and Regulation of Traditional and Alternative Practice

# Production of Quality And Affordable Herbal Medicines and Herbal Products

The Tacloban Herbal Processing Plant (THPP) manufactures Lagundi 300mg tablet for cough and asthma and Sambong 250mg tablet as diuretic and anti-urolithiasis. Likewise, THPP maintains an estimated nine hectares of herbal plantation that serve as source of raw materials needed in their production of herbal medicines.




196, 853 bars of herbal soap produced in 2021

The Cagayan Valley Herbal Plant and Davao Herbal Processing Plant as cosmetic manufacturers were able to produce 196,853 bars of eight variants of herbal soap such as Akapulko, Bayabas, Papaya, Kamias, Cucumber, Carrot, Calamansi and Labanos for personal care. All batches of soap produced were subjected to qualitative test analysis such as physico-chemical properties, weight variation and microbiological test for both raw materials and finished products. Likewise, dermal irritation test is continuously being conducted to ensure their hypoallergenic effects prior to marketing.



As of 2021, there were already four (4) bills that were filed; two (2) at the Senate and two (2) at the Congress. Several hearings and deliberations at the lower house were already conducted on the proposed amendment.


